Dear Parents and Carers,

I am sure you are all pleased to hear the governments announcement this week that in England we are moving towards allowing Plan B regulations to expire including the removal of measures requiring the use of face coverings in communal spaces in all schools. However, infection rates within primary schools in general continue to rise and like many other schools we are struggling with staff absence. We also have a couple of classes where infection rates are high and class numbers this week in these classes have been significantly reduced.

We will continue, for the time being, to retain measures such as mask wearing around school, on the corridors, in communal areas and on the playground at the end of the day, where the context warrants it. These measures are important aspects of infection and prevention control and we need to continue these to keep positive cases as low as possible.

Just a reminder that if your child has a positive lateral flow test result and has symptoms then please book a PCR test. Also a reminder that positive lateral flow tests must be recorded on the government website https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result . If we inform you of a positive case in your child's class you should lateral flow test for 7 days.

On page 2 and 3 of this newsletter you will find some useful updated information regarding current isolation periods.

On a more positive note, Miss Quin, Year 2 class teacher, is performing in a pantomime at the Art Theatre in New Mills from next weekend. If you would like to see her in action please have a look at the poster further into this newsletter. Not forgetting our regular Picture News item with a focus on learning sign language this week.

You will also see in the newsletter an advert for Reception and Year 1 football training as well as an advert for a Stockport County club over half term. If you are involved in clubs outside of school and would like me to advertise anything through this newsletter, please send information to the school office.

### **Changes to Isolation Periods**

The isolation period is still 10 days but can be reduced to 5 full days (as long as your child is well enough and without a temperature) and receives 2 consecutive negative LFD results which were taken 24 hours apart. The earliest they should take the first LFD test is on day 5.

Any positive test after a first negative test would mean that the first negative is <u>null and void</u>. This would reset the isolation period and your child would still require 2 consecutive negative tests from this point forward. You must register results with the NHS Website <u>here</u> and you must <u>e-mail</u> both those results to school. You can order a pack of LFD tests <u>here</u>. TO RETURN ON THE DAY OF A SECOND NEGATIVE TEST, BOTH TESTS WOULD NEED TO BE TAKEN BEFORE 9AM.

In any scenario, the isolation period can only end if your child no longer has a high temperature. This applies even if they have tested negative twice. If children still have a high temperature after Day 10, they should stay off school and seek medical advice such as contacting your GP or phoning 111.
