The government has announced that all children will be back in school in September. We have been told there will be more guidance on this in the coming weeks. I want all the children back at Moorfield as soon as possible, however I also have a duty of care to the adults in the school and our families when they enter the school site. I will share any guidance that comes from central government or the local authority in due course—we really need this to be soon so we can orchestrate a plan and share it with you all before the end of term.

The Education Secretary announced in mid June that schools will not be opening in the summer holidays and because of this, we intend to carry out some necessary building work and general maintenance during this time.

Many of you have been asking about transition. We will share with you next week the class your child will be moving to in September and the plans we have for your child to meet their new teacher. This is not an easy task under the current restrictions, particularly for those children who are still learning from home. Our offer will ensure we keep everybody safe whilst hopefully alleviating some of the anxiety that change brings.

During lockdown, we had a member of staff retire. Mrs Carter, one of our admin team, worked at Moorfield for a number of years and we are very sad to see her go. However we know her new granddaughter will keep her very busy for the foreseeable future! We will also be saying goodbye to Mrs Will at the end of the summer term as she takes early retirement and time away from teaching. Mrs Will has taught many children during her time at Moorfield and we wish her all the best in her new adventure.
