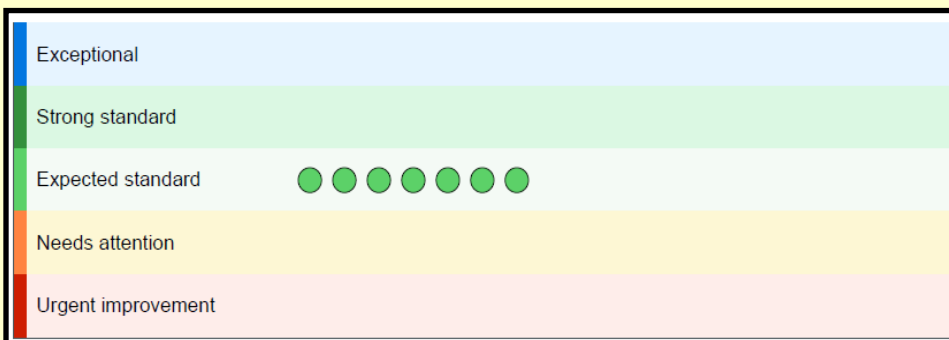

OFSTED OUTCOME—EXPECTED IN ALL AREAS

You will have received the Ofsted report from our inspection in May via email today. It will also be available to read on the school website very soon. Under the new Ofsted Framework, our Report Card shows 'Expected' across all areas. There is a summary of this on the next page.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our staff for their incredible hard work over the last two and a half years since our previous inspection in September 2023. At that point, we had only just started on our new curriculum journey, and many of our subjects and teaching strategies were in their infancy. Since then, while some faces have changed and we have faced the many challenges that naturally come with education, the dedication of our team has never wavered. They have worked tirelessly to ensure that the children of Moorfield receive a wonderful education - one that nurtures them academically and socially and emotionally.

Reading through the report, I am incredibly proud to see the inspectors recognise the impact of the staff's dedication to the pupils. They noted that our children are happy to arrive every morning, settle quickly, and enjoy exceptionally warm professional relationships with the staff. They saw first-hand how our teachers bring learning to life - whether that is through the 'Moorfield Time Machine' in history, outdoor orienteering in maths, or working alongside real scientists.

The report highlights that our pupils feel safe, behave well and are enthusiastic about learning, as well as playing an active role in school life, from helping to design our school badge to sharing ideas for our new building. It also highlights that our whole-school attendance is above the national average.

Our Resource Base and inclusion team - recognising how well they support our children to manage their emotions, stay calm, and access learning with confidence and independence.

Behind every single positive comment in this report, there is a member of staff who goes above and beyond, making Moorfield an inspiring place to grow. I am deeply grateful to our entire team for their commitment to our school.

There is a Q&A session straight after school on Monday for the parents of the children who have been allocated to the Year 2/3 mixed class. This has already been communicated.

Transition Day is on Thursday 2nd July. The majority of Year 6 are on high school transition. Those Year 6 children who have transition days on different dates will still be expected to be in school. They will stay in Year 6 and support the current Year 5 on their transition day.

Children will go to their current class for registration and then move to their new class for the day before returning to their current class at the end of the day. There will be no change to dropping off and picking up.

PTA SUMMER FAIR

The summer fair is taking place on the 3rd July and it will run from 5pm-7pm.

Entrance will be from the middle gate (the one we don't use anymore at the start and end of the day) which takes you to the reception playground. All stalls and activities will be on the KS1 playground/field and in the KS1 hall.



If your child has SEND and finds it difficult in busy environments, we are opening the fair early at 4.45pm to give them 15 minutes access the fair at a quiet time. Entry at 4.45pm will be through the main school reception doors. This early opening time is only for children with SEND and their families. It is a 5pm start for all other families. Entrance will be £1 for adults and children are free.

A reminder to bring bottles next Friday for the fair if you can. This will be another non-uniform day.

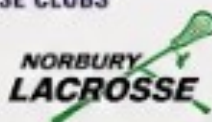

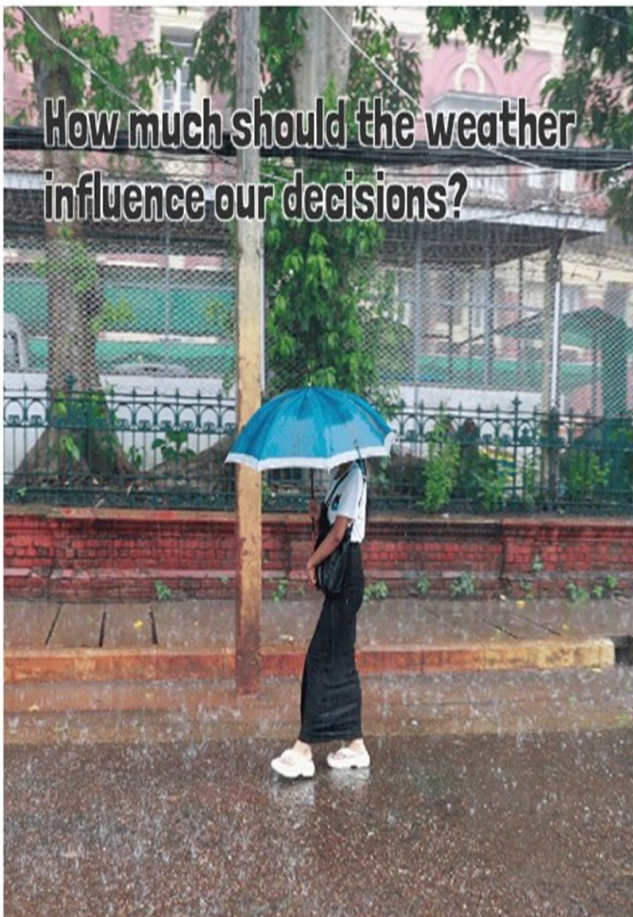


In the news this week
