I hope you were able to come and see the art exhibition in the KS2 hall on Thursday. Parents and children were queuing to get in!


We have registered the school for the Royal Academy of Art's summer exhibition. More information is on the email from Mrs Stout.

A reminder that we will now be celebrating World Book Day 2026 on Friday 6th March. A change from the Thursday due to parents evening.



At Moorfield, we have worked tirelessly to create a love of reading across all classes, and this year we are excited to celebrate World Book Day with a focus on non-fiction texts.

Children are invited to dress up as:

- A person from a non-fiction book (for example, from our popular Little People, Big Dreams collection, which links beautifully with our love of history), or
- A creature or subject from their favourite non-fiction book.

To support learning and discussion, we ask that all children bring in a short piece of written information explaining who or what they have chosen and why. This will be shared during the day.

- Throughout World Book Day, children will take part in a range of exciting activities, including: Staff mystery readers
- Contributing to a whole-school poem
- Ending the day with a whole-school celebration assembly, where reading awards will be presented to star readers across all year groups.
