We recently carried out a 'pupil voice' session with the focus on computing. Many of the children shared that they were comfortable with using the computers and searching on the internet in school because of our safeguarding filter system 'Smoothwall'.

However, some of the children shared their concern that when on the internet at home they see 'pop-ups' that worry them and they can access sites which suggest age appropriate filters are not set. Can you be mindful of what your child is accessing and check your filter levels to ensure the content they are viewing is suitable.

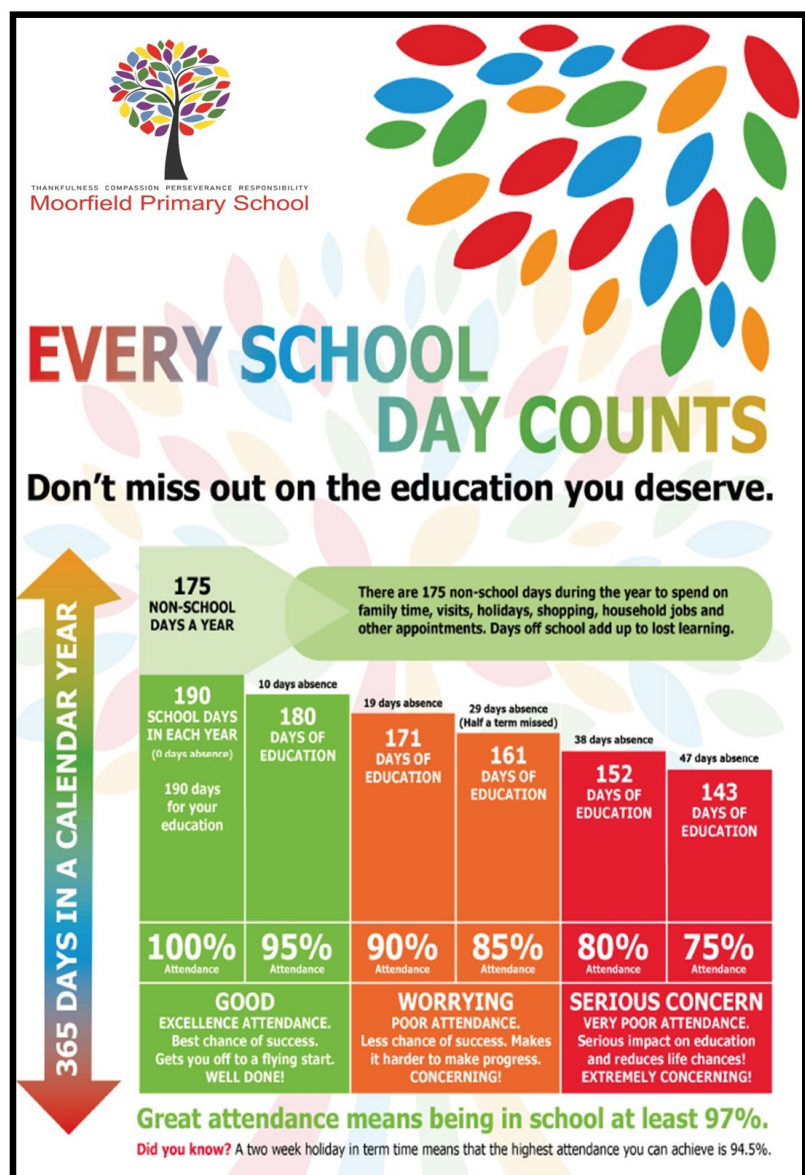
AND FINALLY... PARENT CONSULTATION EVENINGS
