Dear Parents/Carers

Following the welcome meetings this week there have been a number of questions raised and some confusion over a variety of items that were discussed. My apologies for this, I hope the following information alleviates any concerns and explains some of the changes made in greater detail.

Firstly the changes to lunchtime - There has been no change in Reception however we have moved KS1 and Lower KS2's lunchtime to 12.15pm-1.00pm and Upper KS2 to 12.30pm-1.15pm. With our Kaleidoscope Resource Base children having lunch at an appropriate time for them. The reason for this decision is not to reduce the children's enjoyment of lunchtime, far from it as I fully appreciate the importance of the children getting out of the classroom for exercise and an opportunity to play with friends. I have made the decision, after consultation with a number of staff, as I felt the length of lunchtime was leading to a loss of learning time within the classroom and also I feel strongly that whilst children benefit greatly from outdoor play, lengthy unstructured play is not always of benefit to all children. I am very much an advocate of outdoor play and outdoor learning and encourage both teachers and teaching assistants to take the children outside for structured play wherever possible. This can be at anytime of the day and could be linked to a unit they are learning about or the development of the children's mental health and well being. Our school has some excellent outdoor facilities that I want to see being used so I can promise you the more the school utilises the outdoor spaces the better! There is still some work to do with the organisation of lunchtime sittings in the hall as it is taking some children a long time to eat their lunch but this is being monitored to see how we can manage this better.

Another query was class assemblies and Christmas nativities. There will be a nativity in Reception and KS1 will be performing a Christmas production as explained on Monday evening. What hasn't been confirmed yet is what the production will look like as Mrs Shortt and her team are still in the process of identifying a suitable play. KS2 will be involved in their usual Christmas musical performances. There will also be opportunities throughout the year for classes to perform to parents in whole school themed weeks, such as 'storytelling showcase', 'poetry performance' etc. These are similar to class assemblies but an opportunity to see many classes perform at once, creating a greater sense of family and community. I am also hoping to provide yourselves with the opportunity to attend an awards assembly on a half termly basis but this is still in the planning stage at the moment.

Finally, the use of the Heart Garden at the end of school has also been a question brought to my attention. As I explained last week it is for no other reason than the safeguarding of staff and children. It is essential you stay on the playgrounds for the collection of children and don't cut through the back of the school to move from one playground to another. Although I appreciate this is a lovely space to meet and talk, the back of the school is vulnerable to trespassers at the end of the school day particularly. It is my responsibility to ensure everyone is safe and the school site is secured therefore we are asking politely if you could adhere to my request and avoid the use of the Heart Garden.

As a parent and experienced headteacher, I take this opportunity to assure you that any changes that are made are in the best interests of the children and I will be mindful of keeping you more informed in the future through my weekly newsletter. Have an enjoyable weekend.
