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## Privacy Notice (How we use pupil information)

### The categories of pupil information that we collect, hold and share include:

- Personal information (such as name, unique pupil number and address)
- Characteristics (such as ethnicity, language, nationality, country of birth and free school meal eligibility)
- Attendance information (such as sessions attended, number of absences and absence reasons)
- Exclusion information (such as type of exclusion, date of exclusion, reason for exclusion).
- Assessment information
- Medical information
- Special Educational Needs information
- Behavioural information
- Safeguarding
- CCTV images

### Why - we collect and use pupil information

We use the pupil data:

- to support pupil learning
- to monitor and report on pupil progress
- to provide appropriate pastoral care
- to assess the quality of our services
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing
- for transition purposes
- to work with outside agencies


### The lawful basis on which we use this information

There are six legal bases for collecting data which all data collection and processing must fall under:

- Consent: the individual has given clear consent for you to process their personal data for a specific purpose.
- Contract: the processing is necessary for a contract you have with the individual, or because they have asked you to take specific steps before entering into a contract.
- Legal obligation: the processing is necessary for you to comply with the law (not including contractual obligations).

- Vital interests: the processing is necessary to protect someone's life.
- Public task: the processing is necessary for you to perform a task in the public interest or for your official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.
- Legitimate interests: the processing is necessary for your legitimate interests or the legitimate interests of a third party unless there is a good reason to protect the individual's personal data which overrides those legitimate interests. (This cannot apply if you are a public authority processing data to perform your official tasks).

We collect and use pupil information under consent, legal obligation to process necessary information to comply with the law, and vital interest (process which is necessary to protect someone's life), and that the data subject has given explicit consent.

### Collecting pupil information

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the **General Data Protection Regulation**, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if you have a choice in this.

**Special Category Data:** GDPR identifies that some information is particularly sensitive and therefore needs extra protection:

- Racial or ethnic origin
- Political opinions
- Religious or philosophical beliefs
- Trade union membership Health
- Sexual life or orientation
- Genetic data (e.g. blood samples DNA)
- Biometric data to identify an individual (e.g. finger-prints, iris recognition)
- Financial information

**Special Category Conditions:** Under GDPR if you are processing special category data you need to meet a special category condition in addition to the legal basis identified above. The special category conditions are:

- The data subject has given explicit consent
- Necessary to protect the vital interests where the data subject is physically or legally incapable of giving consent
- The data has been made publically available by the data subject
- Necessary for the purposes of preventative or occupational medicine, for example the assessment of the working capacity of an employee
- Required for exercising rights in the field of employment and social security or social protection
- Processing is carried out by a foundation or not-for-profit body in the course of its legitimate activities
- Necessary to process legal claims
- Necessary for archiving statistical or historical research which is in the public interest
- Necessary for reasons of substantial public interest on the basis of UK law which shall be proportionate to the aim pursued

### Storing pupil data

Personal data shall be kept for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which it is being processed. There are some circumstances where personal data may be stored for longer periods (e.g. archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes).



## Who do we share pupil information with?

We routinely share pupil information with:

- schools that the pupil's attend after leaving us
- our local authority
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- NHS
- School Nursing Team
- Under the Keeping Children Safe in Education documentation, other agencies within the Safeguarding arena
- School Counsellor
- Parentpay (cashless school payment system)
- Teacher 2 Parents (online texting system)
- CPOMs (market leading software application for monitoring child protection & safeguarding)
- Educational Psychologist
- SEN (special educational needs staff)
- Sports coaches
- Behavioural Specialists
- Music Service
- Holistic Therapist
- Wellbeing Service
- Residential school trips (eg. Kingswood Colomendy. Petty Pool)
- School Kitchen

## Why we share pupil information

We do not share information about our pupils with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so. We share pupils' data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and educational attainment policy and monitoring.

We are required to share information about our pupils with our local authority (LA) and the Department for Education (DfE) under section 3 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

## Over-claiming hours

In the case of over-claiming hours, we may need to share the names of the childcare settings that your child attends stating the amount of hours that are being claimed. This will only be shared with providers that your child is registered as attending.

## The National Pupil Database (NPD)

The NPD is owned and managed by the Department for Education and contains information about pupils in schools in England. It provides invaluable evidence on educational performance to inform independent research, as well as studies commissioned by the Department. It is held in electronic format for statistical purposes. This information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and awarding bodies.



We are required by law, to provide information about our pupils to the DfE as part of statutory data collections such as the school census and early years' census. Some of this information is then stored in the NPD. The law that allows this is the Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

The department may share information about our pupils from the NPD with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children in England by:

- conducting research or analysis
- producing statistics
- providing information, advice or guidance

The Department has robust processes in place to ensure the confidentiality of our data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access and use of the data. Decisions on whether DfE releases data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data
- the purpose for which it is required
- the level and sensitivity of data requested: and
- the arrangements in place to store and handle the data

To be granted access to pupil information, organisations must comply with strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

### Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, parents and pupils have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, or be given access to your child's educational record, contact the Data Protection Officer or Data Protection Lead.



You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
