
What is e-safety?

e-safety means ensuring that children and young people are protected from harm not only when using the internet, but when using any device which gives them access to the internet.



What do we do at Moorgate to help our children understand e-safety?

- we take online safety seriously
- we deliver age appropriate e-safety lessons
- we listen to children and offer support
- staff receive annual e-safety training
- we adapt our teaching to fit in with current technology, devices and apps.
- we ensure that children are aware of the consequences of their actions online
- we invite parents to annual e-safety sessions

Our Internet Safety Rules:

- At the start of each school year, each class creates its own e-safety rules
- Rules are displayed in each classroom so that children can remind themselves.
- Each child and their parents sign an agreement to show their commitment to using the internet safely.
- Children understand the consequences for not following the e-safety rules

Some online dangers include:

- Cyber bullying: Nasty text messages or emails
- Stranger Danger: We don't always know who we are talking to online.
- Bad language: We may see or hear words that upset us.
- Content: Some material online is not suitable for children .
- Viruses: Some emails and pop-ups may contain viruses



What to do if a child is worried:

- tell an adult they trust straight away if anything worries them
- do not reply to any unkind messages
- do not delete unkind messages as they may be needed for evidence
- **DO NOT KEEP YOUR WORRY TO YOURSELF!**

Handling e-safety complaints:

- Any concern or complaint made by parents/carers regarding e-safety will be handled by senior staff members.
- Parents will be informed if their child is involved with an e-safety concern at school.
- We will seek to resolve concerns and/or complaints promptly
