


In September you will be in Class RC



Key Points for September



- Pupils are expected to attend in September in full school uniform (this includes a plain/logoed burgundy school sweater or fleece).
- Smart black shoes with **Velcro** fastenings.
- In order to ensure the health and safety of our pupils, all children are expected to bring in a full school P.E. Kit (white or black polo shirt/t-shirt, grey/black shorts/joggers and black pumps).
- Ensure all items of clothing are clearly labelled with a wash-resistant pen. We will be unable to guarantee the return of unnamed items that are lost.
- Reading continues to be at the heart of the curriculum at Moorside. With this in mind, we would urge parents and carers to continue to promote reading over the Summer Holidays. Reading a storybook to your child daily for just 10 minutes is one of the best ways to support your child's education
- It is crucial that you read as often as possible with your child (preferably every night) as unlocking reading is the real key to a successful learner. Reading books will be changed on alternate days, but reading records will be checked daily. Dojo points will be awarded for each daily read.
- A phonics booklet will be sent home to support children's developing reading skills during the first half-term.
