## Zebra Crossing and Lollypop Person

We have recently lodged a complaint with Tameside Council about the visibility of road markings on the Zebra crossing directly outside school and the broken light on one side of the pavement. If you live in the immediate area or are concerned like we are around visibility and safety, we would really appreciate it if you could also 'Report a Problem' on the Tameside website so that this gets fixed as soon as possible (there is real strength in numbers).

We have also enquired about going back on the Tameside list for a 'Lollypop Person' as this was something that we bought into two years ago and lost around £12,000 waiting to be allocated a person. In the meantime, when you are out with your children in the morning there will be some good opportunities to reinforce the road safety messages. Please contin-

ue telling your child about the importance of finding safer places to cross, stopping behind the kerb, looking, listening and thinking and holding their hands even. Making sure they have good visibility, taking their hoods down and no distractions with phones and headphones or friends when near roads. This will help all our pupils to develop good road safety habits at an early age and reinforce safety awareness to help keep our children safe.



### **School Grounds**

Thank you for your support with walking in bikes and scooters. We have noticed a huge positive change around the school grounds regarding children turning off phones and coming into school safely. Please can I also remind Parents and Carers not come through the black electric gates on foot as the gates will not stay open and walking through them with your back to oncoming cars puts both drivers and members of the Moorside community at risk.

## **Parent Voice Group**

The first 'Parent Voice' Group was a huge success and was well-attended with over 15 families from across the school. We discussed agenda items such as the 'RSE Curriculum', 'Road Safety' outside and the School's Vision and Values moving forward. Some of which have already been actioned!
