#### **Electric Gates**

Thank you for your support with walking in bikes and scooters. We have noticed a huge positive change around the school grounds regarding children turning off phones, saying 'Good Morning' and coming into school safely. Please can I also remind Parents and Carers not come through the black electric gates on foot as the gates will not stay open and walking through them with



your back to oncoming cars puts both drivers and members of the Moorside community at risk. The only families who should be driving through the gates are those who have 'Blue Badges' or have a pre-arranged agreements with school (for e.g. due to safeguarding). All license plates for 'Blue Badge' holders and for pre-arranged agreements with school are noted down and added to the system. Myself and Mr Mills will be on the school gates every Friday afternoon so hopefully we will see you there soon!
