Parking, Tailgating and Blue Badges

We have recently become aware of growing safety concerns in the school car park, with some vehicles tailgating others to gain access and driving in at high speeds. This behaviour poses a serious risk to the safety of our pupils, families, and staff. Unless there is prior agreement due to safeguarding reasons, an arrangement with the police, or the driver is a registered blue badge holder, vehicles should not be entering the school car park. We are

now taking vehicle registration details, keeping a record blue badge holders, and sharing relevant information with the DVLA and other appropriate authorities where necessary. If you are a blue badge holder, please let the school office know so that we can record this on our system. Thank you for your cooperation and support in keeping our school community safe. Myself and Mr Mills will be on the school gates every Friday afternoon so hopefully we will see you there soon!




Latest News and Updates

Our work with **Voice 21 Oracy** continues to have a brilliant impact across the school. Pupils are becoming increasingly confident, articulate, and reflective speakers who can express their thoughts clearly and listen respectfully to others. Across all year groups, we are seeing children engaging in rich discussions, using ambitious vocabulary, and showing greater confidence when presenting ideas or working collaboratively.

We're excited to offer Year 4 pupils a free 2-night, 3-day residential trip to Whitby, fully funded by the school and our Trust! Children will enjoy a wide range of outdoor and educational activities, including rock pooling, fossil hunting, boat trips, walks, team building, visits to Whitby Abbey, and more, plus a fish and chip tea and a child-friendly Ghost tour. It's an amazing opportunity for adventure, learning, and fun!

From next term, the cost of **Breakfast Club will increase by 50p.** Rising food prices, staffing costs, utility bills, and increased rates mean we are struggling to break even, and without this small increase, keeping the club running would be extremely difficult.
