New PE Kit Reminder and Attendance

Attendance and Punctuality is of paramount importance as we know that pupils with the highest attendance throughout their time in school maximise learning opportunities and are more likely to perform in lessons, exams and formal assessments. 'The more you know, the more you can

learn' and this all starts by being in school on time each day. We understand that some absences are unavoidable, but we believe it's crucial now more than ever to get your child in school and on time every day wherever possible. This will give them the best possible chance of achieving their full potential. If you have any concerns, please contact school and let us know how we can help. Please report any absences due to illness via MCAS. Please can we ask that you avoid using Class Dojo to report any absences as not all staff are able to see individual messages or accounts.

We would like to thank all families for their support with uniforms and ensuring pupils are coming into school looking smart and taking 'Pride' in the way they dress. We have noticed a slight dip in Year 5 and 6 regarding the use of trainers that are not fully black. After the festive season, please can we ask you to support school in ensuring that your child attends school in full uniform and that school shoes/trainers are fully black (any small Nike ticks need to be black as well).

After consulting with the 'Parent Voice' and school community, please see the new and updated 'Uniform Policy' below which will be in place from January 2025. The

main change is regarding PE kits as children will now be allowed to come to school wearing their PE kit on their PE day (teachers will share this day with you). Children will be expected to wear black shorts/joggers and a white T-shirt for PE. This is to ensure that no child in school misses out on PE due to forgetting their kit and will hopefully reduce the amount of time wasted getting children changed at the beginning and end of sessions. Putting this in place will also reduce pressure on parents to bring in 'forgotten kits' and will hopefully ensure a smoother transition from one lesson to the next We hope this a welcomed change families and want to thank you once again for your continued support.
