

We would like to thank all families for their efforts with uniforms and ensuring pupils are coming into school looking smart and taking 'Pride' in the way they dress. Please can we ask you to support school in ensuring that your child attends school in full uniform and that school shoes/trainers are fully black (any small Nike ticks or adidas stripes need to be black as well). Please expect a message from your child's class teacher if pupils are not coming in with the correct uniform. School Protocol

At Moorside, we highly value the on-going positive communication we have with parents and carers, the two-way process of which is vital to the successful support for and education of our pupils. Therefore, I would like to share some updates regarding who to contact in school. Please see the attached 'School Protocol' for further details. If you have any questions about this, please speak to the admin team in the main office.

Football, Social Media and Phones

Thank you for your support with walking in bikes, scooters and ensuring that pupils switch off their phones before coming through the school gate. Please can I ask that footballs are not brought into school (especially in the mornings) as we have had a few of our youngest children either hit or have had near misses due to older children playing football around them before school.

We have noticed an alarming increase in the number of issues taking place on Social Media platforms such as WhatsApp, Snapchat and TikTok and this is often brought into the playground and classrooms. WhatsApp recently announced a change to their terms and conditions for users based in Europe. Users need to be 16 to use WhatsApp. Nearly all other social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age to access and use their services. This includes Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram and Tik Tok. Please can I ask all parents and carers to be extra vigilant and continue to mon-



itor what children are viewing, posting and sending online. It only takes one impulsive photo, video or message to set off a negative chain of events which could ultimately lead to damaging consequences and long-lasting effects.

Parent Voice Group

The 'Parent Voice' Group continues to be a focal point for building stronger relationships between home and school.
