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Parking, Double Yellows and Enforcement Officers

Unfortunately, we have had a high number of community and neighbourhood complaints about parking issues and residents not being able to drive down public streets due to families parking on double yellow lines and blocking roads. We have been sent a number of photos and have received correspondence from Tameside enforcement officers and traffic wardens with several cars blocking dropped kerb driveways and children having to walk on the road to get around parked cars. Marina Road and Medlock Street seem to be the roads with the most issues and safety concerns. According to residents and Enforcement officers, drop -off and collection times seem to be particularly unsafe, which is why Tameside have increased the number of traffic wardens and has issued more fines this month. As a school, we are majorly concerned about reports of children not being able to walk on pavements due to cars being parked unlawfully and kindly ask all parents to refrain from parking in these areas to support us in ensuring the local pavements and crossing zones remain a safe place for everyone.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter and for your ongoing support in helping us maintain a safe school community.

Social Media and Phones

Thank you for your support with walking in bikes, scooters and ensuring that pupils switch off their phones before coming through and leaving through the school gate. We have noticed an alarming increase in the number of issues taking place on Social Media

platforms such as Ometv, WhatsApp, Snapchat and TikTok and this is often brought into the playground and classrooms. Some of these incidents have unfortunately led to suspensions and Police contact. Nearly all social media services require users to be at least 13 years of Vear 6 - VAA/I age to access and use their services (WhatsApp is 16+). This includes Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram and Tik Tok. Please can I ask all parents and carers to be extra vigilant and continue to monitor what children are viewing, posting and sending online. It only takes one impulsive photo, video or message to set off a negative chain of events which could ultimately lead to damaging consequences and long-lasting effects.
