in teams to research facts and have been planning and writing some incredible leaflets to share at the end of the week.


Year 6 have been revising hard and did a fantastic job during SATs week.

Phonics Screening, Multiplication Check Year 4 and **Transition Day for New Classes**

will take place (week beginning the 9th June). We only have one week to administer the screening check for all children so attendance during that week is crucial for Year 1 children as they will have to wait another year if they miss the screening.

The day is an important step in ensuring a smooth and successful transition for your child into their new school year and to formally meet their new classroom teachers.





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Social Media

It has come to our attention that some pupils are using social media to be unkind to other pupils over social media platforms particularly WhatsApp. We understand this has included sharing inappropriate images, leaving unkind comments and using inappropriate language. This has caused problems both in and outside of school and is not in line with our school values.

WhatsApp has an age restriction of 13 years old and therefore is not suitable for primary children to be accessing. However, if you do allow your child to access social media, we kindly ask for you to be extra vigilant and to monitor their usage. What is right will vary from family to family but some strategies that are known to be successful include:

- Regular, unplanned checks of conversations/groups your children are involved in
- Monitor their phones for the apps that are downloaded (age appropriate)
- Make sure parental controls are enabled on phones and consoles
- Setting guidelines about what times they have access to
- Encourage them to share and discuss any issues/worries they may have openly with you
- Speaking to your child about the impact words online can have on individuals and speaking up when this occurs

We are kindly asking for your co-operation in helping us to deal with this. As a parent it is ultimately your responsibility to ensure your child is using their devices and any social media Year 5 — Space appropriately and safely. As always, school staff are continuing to work hard to support our families and reduce social media issues. Many of the issues linked to social media use happen outside of school, but this can have a major impact on the happiness and progress of our pupils. Thank you for your continued support.
