ATTENDANCE

Our whole school attendance figure (including resource pupils) for the Autumn term was 95.3%. This was above the national average at 95.1% so a big thank you for ensuring your children are in school (if they are well). We continue to strive to meet our target of 96%.

60 pupils (28%) had 100% attendance for the Autumn Term and received a bronze certificate. Hopefully many will continue and get silver and gold awards for the spring and summer terms!

29 pupils had attendance lower than 90% so classed as persistently absent. Support will be put in place to ensure this improves.

UNIFORM

Just a reminder that pupils should only be wearing stud earrings NOT hoops or anything hanging below the ear. These studs should be removed on PE days at home. If the ears have just been pierced, they should be covered with plasters at home on PE days. Thank you for your support.
