#### Parents in school

Effective home/school partnerships are key. We are keen to work closely with parents/ carers in school. We have already started individual parent/ carer meetings where pupils have struggled with the return to school or there have been issues with behaviour. Parents evening is coming up for all pupils on Wed 22nd Oct 3.30-7pm. Slots will be booked through Parentmail in due course. Please do your best to attend and contact your child's class teacher if you need an alternative slot - we will do our best to help.

### **Punctuality**

School starts at 8.40am (8.30am for nursery). It is important children are on time and come through their own door to have their safe touch with familiar adults, rather than arrive late and go through the office. With the introduction of One Life morning routine, we are keen to make a prompt start. Thank you for working with us on this. Most children are in school for 8.45am therefore we are trying to close the year 5 and 6 doors at this time. Any latecomers in KS2 can use the Y3 door which will remain open until 8.50am. We understand families with more than one child may take longer to drop off, if it becomes an issue, please let us know. Myself and Mrs Appleyard will pass on any messages to teachers as needed.

#### **Attendance**

Regular attenders make better progress, both socially and academically. Regular attenders find school routines, school work and friendships easier to cope with. The autumn term is a crucial time to establish good routines so if we can help you in anyway to ensure your child is in school, please let us know. Mrs Appleyard and Mrs Grace will support you and your child if they have any worries.

Reminder: Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days. A Penalty Notice may be considered/issued when a pupil has had 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

## **Jewellery**

Firstly, please note pupils should only wear studs, not hoops. We are not able to remove children's stud earrings. Ideally, they should not wear earrings on PE days. If they do wear them, they must be able to remove them for themselves. We can no longer put tape over them. If they have just had them pierced, they may have tape over them for the first 6 weeks. This must be done at home.
