Please ensure that your child comes to school in the <u>correct PE kit</u> on their PE days, including appropriate footwear <u>(no football kits or t-shirts with slogans or different coloured clothing)</u>. Their games session with Mr Stringfellow will be outside, even as it gets colder, so please ensure they have track suits/ jogging bottoms and sweatshirts. For health and safety regulations, your child must have the correct footwear, or will not be able to participate.
