	value in doing so. As a school with a very high level of pupil premium, we feel this is a key area to focus on for our children.
How has your school's spending increased school sport participation?	Staff have ensured that the sports and activities are varied and things the chilkdren may not have experienced before, eg. Judo and dance projects which proved very successful and uptake was high.
How has your school's spending increased pupil participation in extra-curricular activities?	We offered less familiar clubs which meant uptake was high, our Judo club was well attended and staff ran varied ball skill after school clubs. Uptake has been consistently higher than previously.

Three staff members attended the swimming course and one staff member has attended a few forest school courses. This has enabled staff to feel more confident delivering a varied range of activities.
How has your school's spending increased staff participation in extra-curricular activities and school sports competitions?	We have funded transport to allow participation in a wide range of competitive sports. Children have taken part in football matches, cross country and dodgeball competitions

Those who have not, have been identified and top up swimming has been offered. An increased success rate has been seen.
