

English:

This term we will be studying the book 'It Fell From the Sky' by the Fan Brothers. We will be rewriting our own story by focussing on the skills of the past progressive tense, subordinating conjunctions and adverbs of time. Later this term, we will be doing some persuasive writing.

PE:

The outdoor PE topic this term is Athletics where the children will develop basic running, jumping and throwing techniques. The indoor PE topic this term is Fitness. The children will take part in a range of activities that explore and develop different areas of their health and fitness.

Science:

In Science this term, the children will continue learning about plants. They will learn about the different parts of a flower. They will also look at the different sections of the life cycle of a flower. Children will do a number of practical experiments about their learning.

History:

This term, the children will be studying the Anglo-Saxons. They will learn about where they came from, where and why they settled and what life was like during this period.

PHSE:

Learning about relationships is the PSHE focus for the children this term. This will include exploring the different relationships that people have within a family.

French:

This term, in French, the children will learn how to pronounce and write French words linked to animals and colours. They will also learn the French song, 'Le fermier dans son pre'.

Music:

The children will continue to learn how to play the ukulele. They will start their preparations for their ukulele performances in the Music Festival in Term 6.

Maths:

Fractions and Time are the two main topics in Maths this term. The children will be learning how to find fractions of objects and amounts, and time skills will include the calculation of time duration between events.

Computing:

In Computing this term, the children will become familiar with the terms 'text' and 'images' and understand that they can be used to communicate messages. They will use desktop publishing software to create their own magazine front cover.

Art:

The wildlife artist, David Shepherd, is the focus artist for this term. The children will be developing their tone and shape skills as they recreate one of his famous creations.
