

English

Throughout Term 1, we will be reading *The Island*. Year 6 will learn to identify the features of descriptive texts and understand the importance of writing for a particular audience. We will focus on writing to inform; analysing and evaluating a variety of information texts. The children will be composing recounts and reports in which they will utilise these skills and develop their vocabulary and ability to write for purpose.

Religious Education

In RE this term, Year 6 will be studying Islam. Our key question is: What is the best way for a Muslim to show commitment to God? We will be evaluating whether there is a best way for Muslims to do this.

History

This term, we will be researching and learning all about Monarchs. We will investigate how England has been ruled by different people and how their traditions and expectations have changed over time. We will also look into their different ways of life and make comparisons between their lives then and our life now as we know it.

Geography

In Geography, we will use locational knowledge skills to compare two different areas in different eras of time.

Art / Design Technology

During Art and Design lessons, we will look into Tudor fashion and style. We will spend time investigating different textiles and patterns, and then use our sketching skills to design a garment of our own.

Music

Year 6 will continue to learn the clarinet this year. We will be revising notes previously learnt and applying these to new pieces of music.

PSHE

In Year 6, we will be following the Jigsaw scheme of work focusing on 'Being me in my world.' We will explore the meaning of the term 'diversity' when exploring differences.

As we are a values based school, we will be exploring the value of kindness through a cross curricular approach.

Physical Development

This term, we will be focusing on netball as a sport. We will develop our understanding of the attacking and defending principles of invasion games.

We will also be doing OAA (outdoor adventurous activities). We will work individually, in pairs and in groups to solve problems - practising leadership and negotiation skills. We will share ideas to create strategies and plans to produce the best solution to a challenge. OAA also allows us to develop map reading skills.

Maths

We will begin our learning by revising and extending our knowledge of place value. This will lead us onto developing our rounding skills of numbers up to 10 000 000. We will use our new knowledge to revise the formal written methods for the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Throughout the mastery approach, we will then apply our skills to a range of problem solving activities.

Computing

This term, we will explore how data is transferred over the internet. We will look at how the internet facilitates online communication and collaboration; completing shared projects online and evaluating different methods of communication. Finally, we will learn how to communicate responsibly by considering what should and should not be shared on the internet.

Science

This term we will be learning all about animals and the habitats they live in and why. We will also classify these animals using various methods of classification.
