## English - Reading

- Log into bug club to find phonics books that are matched to your child's phonic level (passwords can be found in the home learning pack).
- The books on bug club have a 'read to me' option so your child can enjoy listening to the story after having a go and sounding out themselves.

## Maths

- Check SeeSaw daily for Maths activities.
- Practise halving and doubling to 10 using practical resources such as pebbles, sweets, coins.

## Communication and Language

Talk to somebody at home about how you have grown since you were a baby. What can you do now that you couldn't do when you were 1? What will you learn to do next? Try to use the past, present and future tenses when speaking.

## English - Writing

## Understanding the world

Plant a seed in some soil and look after it over the half term. You will need to water it and make sure it has some sunlight. Talk about the changes you notice with somebody at home. You might like to take pictures. It could be any seed you like but broad beans, cress and sunflowers should grow well.

## Expressive Art & Design

Choose a plant or flower while you are out walk or in the garden. Look carefully at the plant. What colours and shapes can you see? Create a picture of the plant. You might like to use different materials to make a collage or you could use paints or pencils.
