Literacy

(You must complete this activity)

- Read your school book every day.

- Can you write a sentence about your favourite dinosaur using a capital letter, a full stop and finger spaces?

Maths

(You must complete this activity)

- Create a number bonds game to help you learn your number bonds to 10.
- Go on a number hunt and take photos. Which numbers can you spot?
- Build a tower with bricks. Can you build another tower with one more brick? Can you build another with one less brick?
- Make 1-20 number cards and one to twenty-word cards out of paper. Have a go at matching up the numbers and words. Play the memory game, by turning all your cards over and taking it in turns to pick 2 cards. If the number and word matches, you get to keep both cards. The winner is the person with the most pairs at the end.
