



Pupil Premium Statement

What is the Pupil Premium ?

The [pupil premium](#) is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

Pupil premium funding is available to both mainstream and non-mainstream schools, like special schools and pupil referral units.

Funding for 2017 to 2018

In the 2017 to 2018 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years:

- £1,320 for primary-aged pupils
- £935 for secondary-aged pupils

Schools also receive £1,900 for each pupil who is Post-LAC - Adopted from Care, leave care under a Special Guardianship Order or Child Arrangements Order

Total amount of pupil Premium to be received (April 2017)	£282,370

Mount Carmel is expected to receive £282,370 for Pupil Premium students. The Pupil Premium Grant is included in the school's budget plans and, as well as other raising attainment strategies, it will be used to support:

- Additional English and Maths Teachers supporting Pupil Premium students with their learning; £61,824
- Teaching Assistants in English and Maths supporting Pupil Premium students with their learning; £100,967
- Pupil Support Operational Team to address barriers to learning resulting in improved behaviour and attendance; £85,593
- Leadership and Management of Tracking and Monitoring of progress of Pupil Premium students; £7,209
- Part funding educational visits so that all Pupil Premium have the opportunity to take part in these visits. Funding additional Curriculum resources to support Pupil Premium students; Revision guides, stationary, subject specific software 1:1 Maths and English tutors etc. Additional resources to improve parental engagement with school (see parents evening attendance figures) £30,000.
