Summary of next steps for the next academic year (2020-21)

- 1) Swimming remains a significant issue within the school. The percentage of children achieving the curriculum requirement of 25 metres remains below 25%. Additional funding and support for those children not achieving the target is required on an on-going basis.
- 2) The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity is a target for the school. This could be addressed in several ways:
 - Supervised (staff or trained children) break and lunch time **activities** that are structured and physically active.
 - Physically active lunch time **clubs**. This would require qualified staff (internal or externally sourced).
 - A range of physically active after school clubs. This would require qualified staff (internal or externally sourced).
 - Redesign or improvement of playground and field to promote physical activity e.g. mile run track, climbing wall, playground markings for physically active games etc.
- 3) The development of links between the school and external sports providers located in the area would enhance the profile of PESSPA in the school and would lead to more children participating in regular physical activity and competitions. There are many and varied sports groups and facilities in the local area that could provide opportunities for the children at the school to experience physical activity at the highest level.
