
These children have been celebrated in assembly today for achieving the certificate of excellence or the values award for their class:

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I would also like to take this opportunity to remind you of the school registration times. For Years 1-6, the children need to be on the playground in their lines ready to walk to class at 8:40am, after this time they will need to go through the main reception door. If they arrive to school later than 8:50am, they will receive a late mark on the register. For children in nursery, pre-school and reception, the doors open at 8:30am, if they arrive after 8:45am, they will receive a late mark on the register.

For safeguarding reasons, the school gates accessing the playground need to be locked at 8:45am. Mr Scott will be locking these promptly so please can you make sure you are off school site as soon as the bell is rung at 8:40am and the children have walked to their classes, we wouldn't want anyone locked in for the day!
