

Time keeping



- Be Organised (9:00am and 1:00pm start times)
- Don't be late arrive at least 15 minutes before start of exam and assemble on the hard-standing area
- We will begin promptly at the scheduled start time
- If you arrive too late, the exam awarding body might not mark your paper! This is set at 30 minutes.





Exam procedures



The regulations of examinations are set out by JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) and students are reminded of these at the beginning of every exam.

- No attempt to communicate with or distract other students
- Water bottles containing water only with labels removed
- No unauthorised items (revision notes) malpractice







Exam procedures



The regulations of examinations are set out by JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) and students are reminded of these at the beginning of every exam.

- No mobile phones, smartphones or other electronic devices such as Airpods and fitbits in the exam room
- Students found with a mobile phone switched off will be disqualified from that exam
- Students found with a mobile phone switched on will be disqualified from that exam and could be disqualified from all exams set by that exam board





Exam procedures



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
- Watches of any kind are no longer permitted in the exam room
- All items of stationery are provided by the school
- Students must stay in the exam room for the duration of the exam
- Toilet breaks cannot be given during the exam





Your answers





- Exam scripts are scanned and sent off to markers
- Scripts are marked on screen
- You must keep your answers within the spaces provided or they will not appear on your examiner's screen
- •It is important that your hand writing is legible Make it easy for the examiner to read your script
- Lay out your answers clearly Show all working





Illness and Special Consideration



Exams cannot be rearranged if you are unwell.

If you are feeling unwell, come to the exam and the situation can be assessed by the Exams Officer.

If you are very ill and are unable to attend an exam, phone the school first thing in the morning to speak to the Exams Officer. Be prepared to provide a detailed and specific medical note from your GP. (Full details in Examination Guide for Pupils and Parents).

Get them to ask you questions about what you have just taught them - can you answer their questions?










Revision cards – this design allows you to keep the cards together easily. You can colour code the topics or the harder questions.






Revision cards – write exam questions on one side and the answer on the other. Then test yourself or get help from friends and family.


















Post-it Notes
