Back to School Information about Year 1 September 2020

Welcome

Welcome to Year 1. We have been so impressed with the way the children have returned to school. They are full of enthusiasm and it has been a pleasure to get to know them.

Meet the team

Our teaching assistants in Year 1 are Mrs Holmes, Mrs Kamal, Miss Hill and Miss Auld.

Throughout the year there may also be students and/or Norland Nannies working with your children. All students work under the direction and support of class teachers

Learning

In Term 1, our enquiry is 'What makes a hero?'

This means we will be learning about ourselves and our heroes. You may like to ask your child about what they think makes a hero.

Our enquiries for the year include

- How can we look after our planet?
- Whatever next?
- How do we keep safe?
- What is a mini beast?

Planning, Preparation and Assessment

All teachers are entitled to 10% Planning, Preparation and Assessment time (PPA).

PPA time for Year 1 teachers is on Thursday afternoons for the first half of the school year. During these sessions the children will be taught by Ms Card (1K) and Mrs Trenear (1R). 1R will also be taught by Mrs Trenear on a Monday afternoon during Leadership release time.

Overview of a typical day in Year 1

In the mornings we focus on teaching, maths, English and phonics. We have a break at 10 o'clock followed by snack time. In the afternoons we start by teaching Guided Reading then move on to other subjects such as art, P.E., R.E., Science and P.S.H.E. (Personal, Social & Health Education). We have a break towards the end of the afternoon, and then either a class assembly or story.

P.E.

Our P.E. days are **Tuesday** and **Friday**. Children should come to school in P.E. kit on these days

Children can currently wear trainers for P.E. and can wear leggings or tracksuit bottoms on cold days.

Long hair must be tied back and earrings must be removed or covered with tape provided from home.

Drinks and snacks

Please send the children with a named water bottle every day.

A daily healthy snack is provided for your child.

Behaviour and Rewards

In line with our behaviour policy, the traffic lights will continue to be used. This is a whole school system which encourages positive behaviour. If you would like any more information on this, please see the Behaviour Policy document on the school website or ask any member of our team. We will use house points across the school (Windsor **Green**, Clevedon **Blue**, Pulteney **Yellow** and Churchill **Red**) & Star of the Week certificates will be given out on Fridays. If we need to contact you about a behaviour issue we will phone you as it is not possible to speak in person at this time.

Toilets

The children can use the toilets in the classroom at any time during the school day. We encourage the children to use the toilet whenever they need to. Please let us know if there are any specific needs.

Supporting your child

Reading: As a school we place a high emphasis on reading. Please continue to read regularly with your child at home. Our aim is that every child reads at least 3 times a week at home, although daily is even better. The key thing to remember is little and often is best. It is also essential that you ask your child to retell what they have read and for you to ask them some questions about it. Comprehension skills are equally as important as decoding skills, to be a good reader your child must have both. Due to the current situation and government safety guidelines we have reviewed our book change system in school. We remain committed to maintaining the high profile of reading and want to ensure that every child always has a book to read or share at home on every day of the week. From Monday 14th September we will introduce the following system for changing books in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Please ensure that the Reading Record and reading books are kept in book bags and brought to school every day. If you have any questions about your child's reading, or their progress, please email the class teacher rather than writing comments in the book. Please see over the page for Newbridge 'Must Reads'.

Monday – Your child will be allocated a phonics based reading book. This must be returned on the Thursday of the same week.

Thursday – your child will choose a levelled reading book from the class and a library book to share at home. These must be returned on the following Monday.

This system ensures that we can quarantine books between uses and enable us to have sufficient books for your children to choose from.

We still ask that you continue to write a short, positive comment in the reading record book so that we know that books have been read and are ready to be changed.

Home learning: Future home learning activities such as weekly spellings will be introduced throughout the year so that the children are not overloaded. The school will continue to subscribe to Doodle English for each pupil and is very soon going to purchase Doodle Maths for each pupil.

Children's belongings: Please ensure that water bottles, book bags and waterproof coats are brought to school daily. Water bottles should have a sports cap to help prevent spillages. All items of clothing and other items such as water bottles should be named. The children should be wearing shoes to school, except on P.E. days when they should come to school in their kit and trainers.

Phonics

Children will continue to have daily phonics sessions. All children will take part in the Phonics Screening Assessment at the end of Year 1. More information on this will follow later in the year.

Inhalers

If your child needs an inhaler please check they have an in date one in school and that you have filled out an indemnity form. This can be found on the school website via the following link

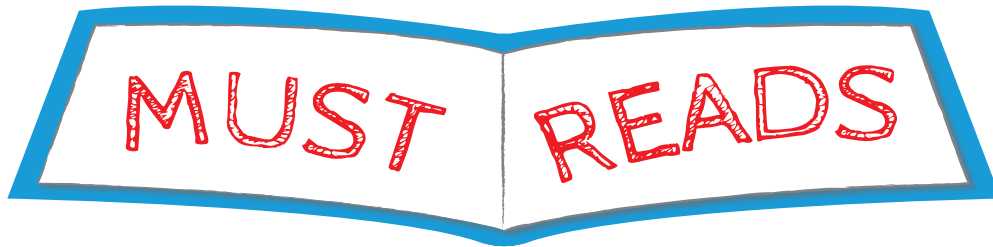
