Daily reading

Today, please read for at least 20 minutes.

This week, we would love you to write a review on the book you have been reading! Perhaps you could answer one of these 5 questions each day? If you have only just started a new book, you could write a review of the last book you have read. **Today have a go at Question 5!**

- 1.) Can you describe the plot? What happens in the story?
- 2.) Where is the story set? Is there more than one setting?
- 3.) Who is your favourite character and why?
- 4.) Can you describe your favourite part of the book?
- 5.) Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why/why not? (Give a 5-star rating)

Daily times tables

By the end of Year 3 you will need to know times tables up to 2, 5 and 10 (end of Year 2 expectations) 3, 4 and 8 (end of Year 3 expectations) You will need to spend time focusing on these using various websites or playing squirt as we talked about.


The Year 3 Team see this as really important learning so expect you to spend a minimum of 15 minutes a day learning your times tables.

Divide the numbers by the middle number.




Daily Maths


BIRD WATCHING!

Today, in maths, you will be using the data you have collected about the birds you have seen in your garden. We will be converting your tally chart into a bar graph or pictogram to display your information!

Remember – this is a pictogram:

Think about:

Where will the number of birds go on your axis? Where will the names of birds go on your axis? What will the title of your pictogram/bar graph be?

Remember:

Use a ruler, colour within the lines – PRESENTATION!

Go: Can you think of some questions you could ask a family member about the graph? Eg. Which bird appeared the most? How many birds flew into the garden altogether?

Daily English

Today, we are going to put our understanding of contractions and our spelling words into context. We would like you to write a paragraph about something you are enjoying doing whilst being at home.

Within your paragraph of writing, you need to include this week's spellings and words with contractions in. We are looking forward to reading what you've been up to!

Ready: All spellings and 3 or more contraction words

Steady: All spellings and 5 or more contraction words

Go: All spellings and 5 or more contraction words AND a quote from a family member (using direct speech)
