Daily counting, number bonds or times tables

Play Bingo

You will need numbers to 30 in a pot.

Children write 6 numbers between 1 and 30 on a piece of paper.

Call a number at a time for children to cross it off their paper.

Make it more difficult by saying a calculation e.g. half of 6, instead of saying 3.

Daily Maths

Today, we are going to have one last day on learning about patterns and shape.

We are focusing on symmetry.

Can you find things in your home that have a line of symmetry?

Your challenge is to make a butterfly that is symmetrical. You can choose how to make it.

Here are some ideas -

• Draw a butterfly outline and cut it out.

• You could paint one side and fold it in half to print the other side.

• Use pens to draw the same pattern on both sides.

Use potatoes to make potato prints on both sides.

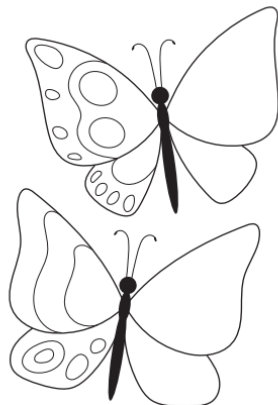
Draw a butterfly in your maths books and colour in the squares.

Make a Lego butterfly, you might want to draw the butterfly on paper first.

Choose a butterfly that needs a pattern extending and copying such as

Symmetry means that both sides are the same. Can you finish the butterflies so that the wings match? When you finish, color in the butterflies.



You could play this as a game.

Take turns to draw something on a wing and the other player has to copy it on to the opposite wing.

Try and find time to practise your colouring, cutting and sticking skills over the holidays.

Write about it. Remember to use a capital letter and full stop for each sentence. Can you challenge yourself to extend some sentences using and, because or but?
