

Daily reading	Today, please read a book of your choice for 10 minutes then spend 5 minutes retelling what you have read and answering questions about it. Please ask an adult to help you with this.

Daily counting, number bonds or times tables	This week, we will focus on knowing number bonds to 10 (or up to 20) without using resources to work them out. Children should be able to recall the answers quickly.
	Number bonds that equal 10. Use the number cards from Monday (0-10).
	Put the cards face down so that you can play the memory game. Children have to find the pair that make 10. Remember the focus is on knowing the answer and not challenging them to work it out.
Termly Spellings	 Please take time to learn spellings for future weeks and to re-visit past spellings. These can be found on the school website at https://www.newbridge.bathnes.sch.uk/ and go to the tab Classes and click on your class. Here is another way to try. Draw around the words making a clear distinction in size where there are ascenders and descenders. Look carefully at the shape of the word and the letters in each box. Now try to write the word making sure that you get the same shape.
Daily Maths	Look at the forest. Some fairy tale characters live in the woods. Copy the forest into your book or print it out (a bigger copy is at the bottom of today's learning). The footprints show where to start. Follow the instructions to find out where Goldilocks and Red Riding Hood live. Mark the houses on your map. To Goldilocks' House Forwards 3. Turn right. Forwards 4. Turn right. Forwards 4. Turn right. Forwards 2.
Daily English/ Phonics	Writing: Please see the activity under Healthy Me.
	Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.

Healthy Me	The theme for our Jigsaw PSHE work this term is 'Changing Me'.	
	Start by doing your Jigsaw Jack calm breathing. Try to ask someone in your family to join in. Now teach someone in your family the song 'Heads, shoulders, knees and toes'.	
	Today, we'd like you to think about what it's like to be getting older. Talk to a grown up about what it's like to be older. For example, think about what you can do now that you couldn't do before? How does it make you feel? In your book complete the stem sentence - <i>I am pleased I am getting older because</i> You might like to draw a picture too.	
	Frozen toy break-out: Can you choose a container, put some small plastic toys in it, fill with water and freeze it. Once they are frozen, can you find a way to release them from the ice?	
Problem of the Day	Challenge – Today, can you find a time to lie on the floor and look for shapes in the clouds?	
Day	Can you build a famous landmark? This could be the Eiffel Tower, Stonehenge or maybe you'd like to create a new famous landmark! Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to design the landmark.	
	Riddle of the day – What has a neck but no head?
