<p><b>Daily counting</b></p>	<p>How many songs can you think of that involve counting? Five currant buns? Ten little monkeys? Have a go at singing them together.</p> <p>Lots of families have been accessing the BBC Bitesize Maths Learning, here is the link if you would like to access this yourself. <p><b>Tricky words</b></p>	<p>Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day.</p> <p>Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Peg the tricky words on a line. Unpeg them and put them in a basket when you know them.</li> <li>- Put the tricky words in a box. Rummage around and pick out a tricky word to read.</li> <li>- Write the tricky words on a label and stick them to a toy car. Draw some parking spaces with the matching tricky word on a piece of paper. Drive in the matching tricky word!</li> <li>- Write the tricky word in lots of different sizes!</li> <li>- Chalk the tricky word on paper, chalkboard or paving.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Daily Maths</b></p>	<p>Please choose one or more of these fun activities to enjoy consolidating subtracting single digit numbers:</p> <p>Indoor – Have 10 1p pieces and 10 'items for sale' for 1p each. E.g. How many coins would your child have left if they bought 3 toys? <math>10 - 3 = 7</math>.</p> <p>Outdoor - Set up a teddy bear picnic with 10 toys. How many toys would be left if 3 toys went home? You could talk about subtraction using plastic food or little treats too!</p> <p>Online game - <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/mental-maths-train">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/mental-maths-train</a></p>
<p><b>Daily English/Phonics</b></p>	<p><b>Phonics:</b> Today's sound is 'ur'. Can you think of any 'ur' words yourself? Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – fur, surf, burn, turn Can you circle the digraph 'ur' in each word? Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is? (e.g. <u>key</u> - 2 letters that make one sound) What does 'ur' look like in capital letters?</p> <p>Optional game - <a href="https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/space-race">https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/space-race</a> Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> How do you think you make carrot soup? Write your own instructions to make carrot soup! Can you include any tricky words? What words might you need to use in instructions? Mix, pour, blend?</p> <p>Remember to use finger spaces, capital letters and full stops!</p>
