<p>Daily reading</p>	<p>We hope that you were able to access Oxford Owl (https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/) If you haven't done so already, please sign up for a free account to access the daily reading. This week's book is the Little Red Hen: (https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital_books/1415.html) Today, we'd like you to just enjoy the story. You might like to have another listen to the audio, or you might like to have another go at the online activities. If you were unable to access this eBook, please used the PDF version of the story. Please contact your teacher if you are unable to access online eBooks so we can plan accordingly.</p>
<p>Daily counting</p>	<p>Clap 5 times. Can your child count them and tell you the answer? Repeat with different numbers. See if they can count up to 20 claps. Can they have a go at doing it the other way around?</p>
<p>Tricky words</p>	<p>Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day.</p> <p>Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write the tricky word in as many different colours as you can! - Make the tricky word from play dough - Go on a tricky word hunt, by hiding them around one of the rooms in your house - Play tricky word snap, by having two copies of tricky words and matching them up - Call out a tricky word and your child has to point to them with a stick/wand, shoot them with a nerf gun, or place a counter on them!
<p>Daily Maths</p>	<p>Today, we are going to continue to practise adding two single digit numbers together. Today, use a dice, (if you don't have one, here is the link to an online dice https://dice.virtuworld.net/). Roll a number and write it down. Roll again and write the number down. What is the total of the two numbers?</p> <p>To challenge, try adding 3 single digit numbers together!</p>
<p>Daily English/Phonics</p>	<p>Phonics: Letters 'oa'. Can you think of any 'oa' words yourself? Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – goat, moat, float, toast Can you circle the digraph 'oa' in each word? (e.g. <u>key</u> - 2 letters that make one sound) Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is? What does 'oa' look like in capital letters?</p> <p>Optional game - https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/pick-a-picture Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p> <p>Writing for Thursday AND Friday Have a look back over your English work from yesterday. How could you improve your work? Could you add anything to your picture? Could you add some more sentences/words to make your story more exciting? Remember your capital letters and full stops. Don't forget to use pre-cursive handwriting.</p>
