

**Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> April:**

*Good morning Bee and Ladybird Class. This is the last day of term before the Easter holidays! We hope you have a nice break and enjoy your 2 weeks off!*

<b>Daily reading</b>	Today, please read a book of your choice for 10 minutes then spend 5 minutes retelling what you have read and answering questions about it. Please ask an adult to help you with this.
<b>Daily counting</b>	Practise your number bonds to 10. (e.g. 6+4=10) If this is a bit tricky, please continue to practise number bonds up to 5. An idea for how to learn them is by using a number line or natural objects for support.
<b>Tricky words</b>	<p>Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day.</p> <p>Here are some ways to help you practise:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Copy down each word.</li> <li>• Circle the digraphs in each word. (e.g. <u>key</u> - 2 letters that make one sound) (Digraph is two letters that make one sound)</li> <li>• Write in different shapes.</li> <li>• Look, write, cover, check</li> <li>• Each letter could be a different colour</li> <li>• You could ask a grown up to give an example of when this word could be used.</li> </ul> <p>Can you write each one in a sentence?</p>
<b>Daily Maths</b>	<p>This activity is split into 2 stages;</p> <p>Hold up 5 fingers. Can you count them? What is 1 less than 3? 1 less than 4? Ensure your child can understand the word less. Explain that this is the opposite of more. Instead of jumping forwards on a number line, we jump backwards.</p> <p>Provide your child with a piece of paper that has the numbers 1-5 written on. Can your child write down what one less than each number is? In what other ways can they represent this? (Drawing pictures might help them represent this.)</p>
<b>Daily English/Phonics</b>	<p><b>Phonics:</b> Letters 'th'. Write out the words – maths, cloth, thin and Beth. Can you circle the digraph 'th' in each word? Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is? What does 'th' look like in capital letters?</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> Now can you draw a picture of something that includes the letters 'th'? Can you write a sentence to caption this?</p> <p>Try and include at least one tricky word. Remember your capital letters and full stops. Don't forget to use pre-cursive handwriting.</p> <p>Optional game - <a href="https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/PictureMatch.html">https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/PictureMatch.html</a></p> <p>Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p>

<b>Problem of the day</b>	Challenge – You and your friends decide to build a tree house. Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to build a standing tree house.
<b>The activities below are supplementary and can be used to further extend learning opportunities whilst at home.</b>	
<b>National Curriculum Word Lists</b>	Look in your Reading Log and find all of the spellings for your year group. How many of these can you learn? Can you write a sentence using the words?
<b>Curriculum Overview</b>	Take time to look at the Curriculum Overview for your year group.
