- You could also find out their meaning by using a dictionary.

Draw a range of 2D shapes, then accurately measure their sides. Record each measurement next to the correct side:

6 cm 6 cm

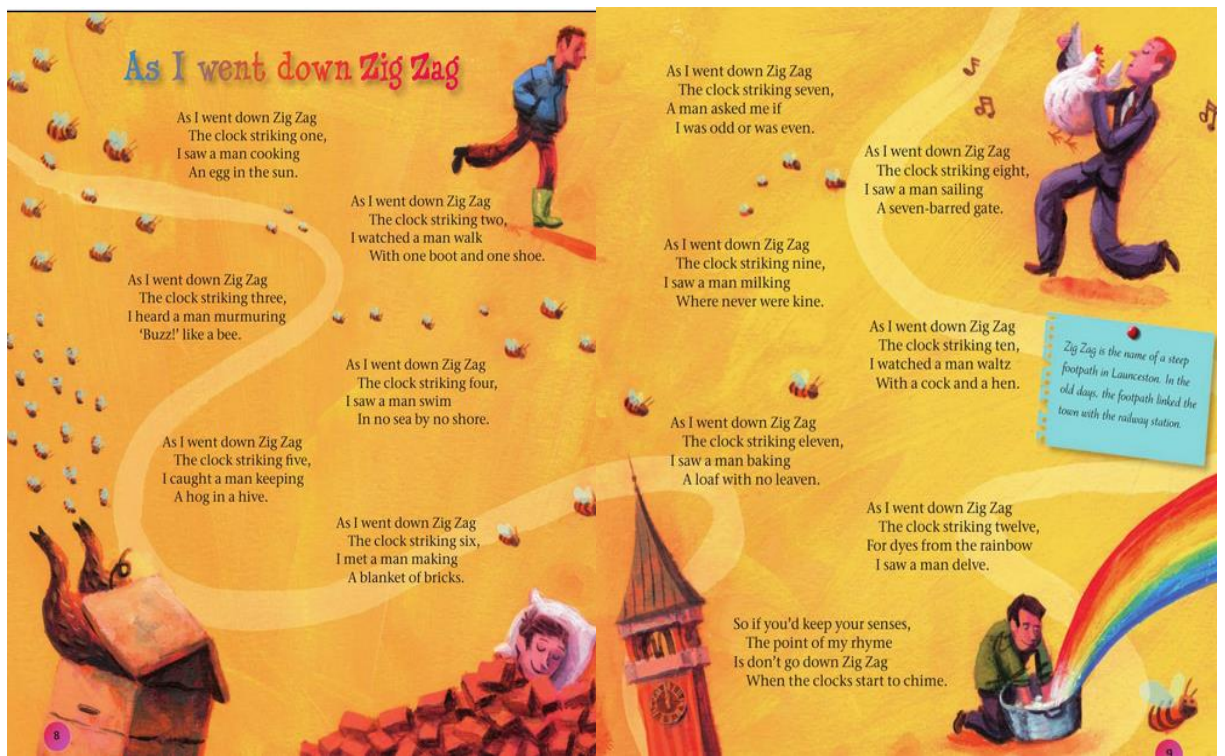
4 cm
