Daily reading

Daily counting

Do you have a skipping rope? If not, you can just do jumping jacks. Can you skip 10 times without stopping? Now can you skip 10 times whilst counting in 2s? Can you skip by counting backwards? How far can you go?

Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words.

These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.

Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Paint a rainbow on your page. Write a tricky word over the top of each colour with a matching felt tip. (E.g 'the' could be red, 'I' could be yellow, etc.)
- Make the tricky words from play dough. To challenge yourself, make a sentence from playdough including at least 1 tricky word!
- Make your own flip book of tricky words. Flip through each tricky word until you become more confident with them.
- Write the word at the bottom of some kitchen roll for your child. Fold the top over to cover the tricky word. Put the kitchen roll in water and it will magically appear! Ask your child what the tricky word is.
- Have a coloured tray/coloured small plate of flour. Write the tricky word in the flour.

Daily Maths

Last week, we worked on adding numbers to 10. This week we are going to continue to practise adding 1 and 2 digit numbers, however we won't just be adding numbers to 10 (e.g. $14 + 3 = 17$). Your activity today is a preparation activity for the rest of the week. We want you to think of a creative way to make a number line to 20. We have included an example of one that we like below. We would love to see photos of your work.



Grown-ups – A quick message to let you know where we plan on taking our learning. This week, we will consolidate our learning of adding up to 20. After this, we will move onto doubling, halving and sharing numbers.

Daily English/Phonics	<p>Phonics: Today's sound is 'ure'. Can you think of any 'ure' words yourself? Write out these words in pre-cursive handwriting – sure, picture, manure, pure. Can you circle the trigraph 'ure' in each word? (e.g. <u>ma<u>ch</u></u> - 3 letters that make one sound) Can you explain to your adult what a trigraph is? What does 'ure' look like in capital letters?</p> <p>Optional game - https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/picnic-on-pluto</p> <p>Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p> <p>Writing: Did you enjoy Silver Foil Rocket? Draw your own rocket in your favourite colour. Use describing words to write sentences all about your rocket. If you're not sure, just sound out and write the words. To challenge yourself, use these sounds in your words: ee, oo, ur, oi</p> <p>Super writers use: capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, cursive writing! Super writers can also use sound cards and tricky word mats to help them!</p>
Healthy Me	What would you describe as a healthy meal? What is your favourite healthy food to eat? Can you create a plate that includes all of your favourite healthy snacks?
Daily Challenge	Can you draw or making a 2D rocket, only using these shapes: rectangle, triangle, circle?
