Good morning Year 1. We hope you had a good weekend. Did you manage to guess the answer to Friday's riddle? The answer was **neither, they both weigh one kilogram**. Did you know that on some birds their feathers can weigh more than their skeletons? This is particularly true for flying birds, which have the lightest (mostly hollow) bones to keep them airborne. In some species, a bird's skeleton represents only 5 percent of its total body weight, meaning their feathers account for a substantial portion of the rest. Keep working hard and trying your best!

Daily Maths

Choose a 3D shape and draw around one of the faces to make a 2D shape.

e.g. Draw around the side of a cuboid such as a cereal box, to make a square or rectangle.

<p>Daily English/ Phonics</p>	<p>Writing: Today’s writing links to our learning in R.E. We are going to think about the Jewish festival of Yom Kippur.</p> <p>Please ask a grown up to read the attached information about Yom Kippur to you. Talk about it together. What can you remember about Yom Kippur? Now you are going to write about the festival. Maybe you could include information about when the festival is? How do people celebrate? Do people eat special foods? Remember to start each sentence with a capital letter and end with a full stop. Try to make your writing interesting by including adjectives or extending sentences with and, but or because.</p> <p>Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.</p> <p><i>It was Sunday and Jane went to play with her puppy.</i></p> <p>Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?</p> <p>Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.</p> <p>visit flape zigzag smenp</p> <p>Can you put each of these common exception words into a sentence?</p> <p>you your they</p> <p>Optional game – You have played lots of different phonics games this term. Please pick your favourite game from – https://www.phonicstracker.com/games/index to play today.</p>
<p>Healthy Me</p>	<p>Cosmic Kids Yoga – Energy Yoga - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iqao33tX6-M</p> <p>Musical Statues - Play some music with everyone in your household, pause the music and everyone has to stay as still as they can be. The person who moves has to sit out but can join in again for the next round.</p>
<p>Problem of the Day</p>	<p>Challenge – The aliens are back! No, they are not after your underpants they want a new flying saucer. Can you build them a flying saucer? Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to create the alien’s new flying saucer.</p> <p>Riddle of the day - What can run but can’t walk?</p>
