# Daily counting, number bonds or times tables

This week, we will focus on knowing number bonds to 10 (or any number up to 20) without using resources to work them out. Children should be able to recall the answers quickly.

## Number bonds that equal 10:

Make number cards to 10 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10

Pair the numbers to make 10.

Which number is left? 5

Why? It needs to be doubled.

Set your own number target. Maybe you could time how quickly you can find the pairs? If you choose a higher number, you will need to make the number cards to match it.

You might like to trey this method of learning words forces you to think of each letter separately.

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
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#### **Daily Maths**

Read 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and write down all of the position words you can find in the story. Can you think of any more position words that haven't been used in the story?

# Position



Act it out: - An adult or a sibling can be the audience and the child pretends to be the actor or actress on the stage. The child faces the group and then either moves forwards or backwards. The audience say out loud either "forwards" or "backwards" in response to the movement. Take turns being the "star", to practise this movement concept. Make up a dance/exercise routine together saying the positions as you move. e.g. 2 steps forward, jump over the book, slide to the right, turn to the left, crawl under the blanket. Children we need to practise left and right this week. **Challenge** - Make a word mat like the one above to show that you understand the position words. Daily English/ Writing: **Phonics** Today, you are going to write about and describe Spring weather. To help you, look at the labels you added to your Spring picture last week. Write some sentences in your book describing the weather in Spring. Remember to include a capital letter, finger spaces and full stop for each sentence, think about including adjectives too. Also, if you use the name of the season, remember it will need a capital letter. **Dictated sentence:** Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence. The frog jumps in a pond. Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when? Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words. blurst church ploot play Play Quick Write. Problem of the Challenge – Today, can you listen out for birdsong? Try to learn who it's coming from. Can you create day a house for a bird? Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to make your house. Riddle of the day – What lives in winter, dies in summer, and grows with its roots upward?
