We would love to see some photographs of what you got up to! Our enquiry this term is 'What is a Story?', so this is what our Daily Learning will be based on.

Daily reading

Our stories are going to come from a website called Oxford Owl (<https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/>) Please sign up for a free account to access the daily reading.
This week's book is the Little Red Hen: (https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital_books/1415.html)
Today, please listen to the audio by clicking the 'play' button as you flick through the pages.
If you are unable to access this E-Book, please use the PDF version of the story to read to your child and let your teacher know so that we can plan accordingly.
Please do this alongside a variety of other books at home.

Daily counting

Number Hunt! Use number cards from 0-20 or write numbers on a piece of paper and cut them up. Hide the numbers around the room. Find all of the numbers and order them to 20. Can you count to 20 whilst pointing at each number? Can you count backwards?

Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words.
These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.
Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day.
Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could try one a day this week.

- Write the tricky word in as many different colours as you can!
- Make the tricky word from play dough
- Go on a tricky word hunt, by hiding them around one of the rooms in your house
- Play tricky word snap, by having two copies of tricky words and matching them up
- Call out a tricky word and ask your child to point to them with a stick/wand, shoot them with a nerf gun, or place a counter on them!

Daily Maths

Use the number line you made from the number hunt.
Can your child point to a given number? Can your child represent that number with objects?
e.g: Can you count out 6 raisins?
Mix up the numbers, ask your child to order them backwards from 20! If this is too challenging, order backwards from 10 or 5 initially.

Daily English/Phonics

Phonics:

Letters 'ng'.
Can you think of any 'ng' words yourself?
Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – pong, strong, thing, ring
Can you circle the digraph 'ng' in each word? (e.g. key - 2 letters that make one sound)
Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is?
What does 'ng' look like in capital letters?

Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.

Writing:

Think about the story of the Little Red Hen. Can you draw a picture of the hen? Write a sentence/sentences about the hen, beginning with "The hen is". Can you sound out some words to describe the hen? Can you use some tricky words in your sentences?

Remember your capital letters and full stops. Don't forget to use pre-cursive handwriting.
