Get out your number cards to 20 from last week. Ask your child to place the cards in order. Then ask them to close their eyes and remove some of the cards. Can they recognise and tell you which numbers are missing?

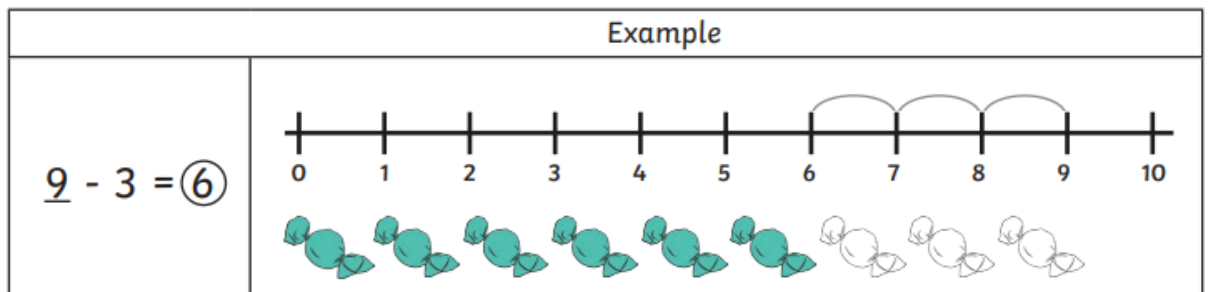
Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words.
These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.
Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Peg the tricky words on a line. Unpeg them and put them in a basket when you know them
- Put the tricky words in a box. Rummage around and pick out a tricky word to read
- Write the tricky words on a label and stick them to a toy car. Draw some parking spaces with the matching tricky word on a piece of paper. Drive in the matching tricky word!
- Write the tricky word in lots of different sizes!
- Chalk the tricky word on paper, chalkboard or paving.

Daily Maths

Last week, we learned how to add two single digit numbers together. This week, we are going to learn to subtract single digit numbers. Draw out a number line to 10. Randomly select a single digit number card to subtract. Model to your child how to subtract by jumping back on the number line. For example:



If this is too challenging, you may like to start with subtracting 1. If this is too easy, you may like to subtract single digit numbers from 20.

Daily English/Phonics	<p>Phonics: Today's sound is the long 'oo' sound. Can you think of any long 'oo' words yourself? Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – moon, zoom, boom, baboon Can you circle the digraph 'oo' in each word? Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is? (e.g. <u>key</u> - 2 letters that make one sound) What does 'oo' look like in capital letters?</p> <p>Optional game - https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/pick-a-picture</p> <p>Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p> <p>Writing: Did you enjoy the story of 'The Big Carrot'? What was your favourite part? Can you think of a vegetable that could grow BIGGER than your house? Maybe a giant potato, or a giant cabbage?! See if you can draw it in your book and write a caption using your drawing. "The Big (you choose)" To extend your writing, you could write about the colour or the flavour of your vegetable!</p> <p>Remember to use capital letters and full stops, tricky words, cursive writing AND finger spaces!</p>
Healthy Me	<p>Have you tried the Joe Wicks work out? You can stream this on YouTube at 9am every morning. https://www.youtube.com/user/thebodycoach1</p> <p>You could also try this fun work out: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=d3LPrhI0v-w</p>
Problem of the day	<p>Uh oh! The Big Carrot isn't going to fit into the cooking pot without being cut up first! Draw a giant carrot on a piece of paper and see if you can cut it up into lots of pieces.</p>
