	If this is a bit tricky, please continue to practise number bonds up to 5.
	An idea for how to learn them is by using a number line or natural objects for support.
Tricky words	Please take time to learn your tricky words.
	These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.
	Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day.
	Here are some ways to help you practise:
	Copy down each word.
	<ul> <li>Circle the digraphs in each word. (e.g. key - 2 letters that make one sound)</li> </ul>
	Write in different shapes.
	Look, write, cover, check
	Each letter could be a different colour
	• You could ask a grown up to give an example of when this word could be used.
	Can you write each one in a sentence?
Daily Maths	This activity is split into 3 stages;
	You will need number cards up to 15. Shuffle your cards and take turns putting each number on the
	table. Ask your child to tell you what one more than that number would be. Can they write this down
	Allow your child to use a number line to help them.
	Again, ensure that your child can understand the word more. Reiterate that when we add more, we move up the number line.
	Using natural objects (a garden would be good if accessible) write a number down and ask your child
	to collect one more than that number e.g. write 7 down and your child should collect 8. Keep repeating this until you get to 15.
	You could evidence this by asking your child to draw pictorial representations of this or take photos of this and stick them into their books.
Daily	Phonics:
English/Phonics	Letter 'z' and 'zz'
	Write out the words – jazz, zebra, zigzag and fuzz.
	Can you circle the letter 'z' or 'zz' in each word? What does 'z' look like as a capital letter?
	Writing:
	Now can you draw a picture of something that includes the letters 'z' or 'zz'? Can you write a sentence to caption this?
	Try and include at least one tricky word. Remember your capital letters and full stops. Don't forget to use pre-cursive handwriting.
