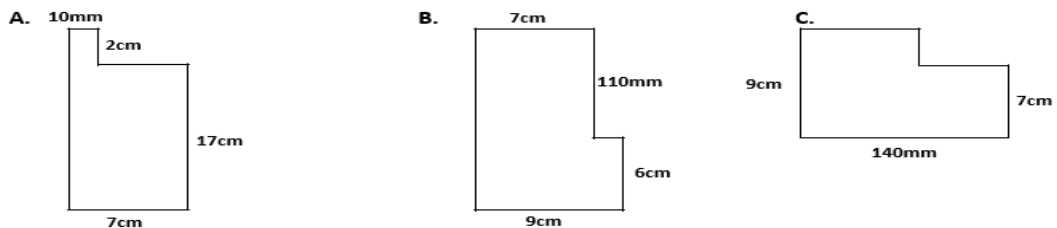

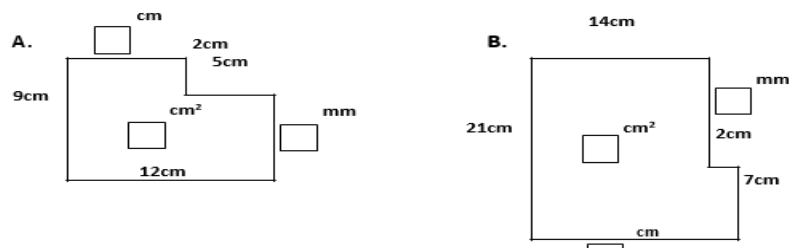
4. Circle the shape has a different total perimeter to the others.

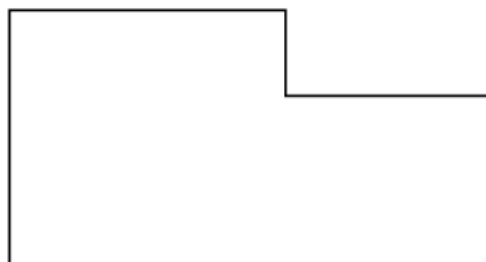

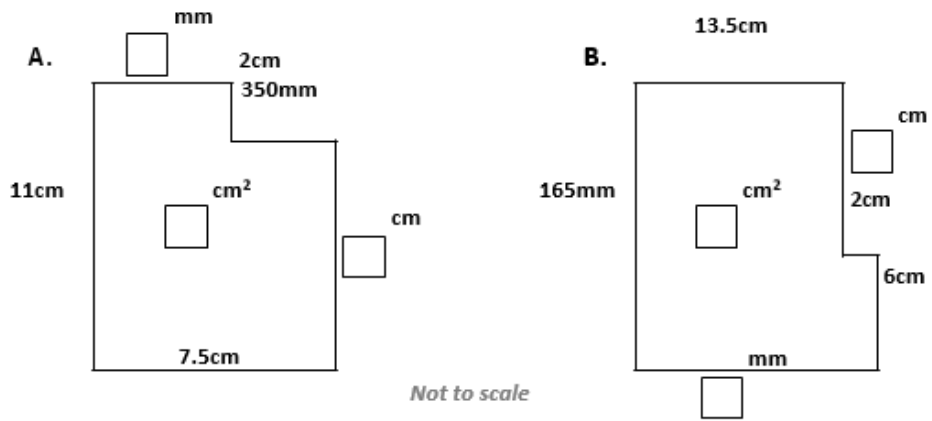
6. The shape below has an area greater than 100m<sup>2</sup>.

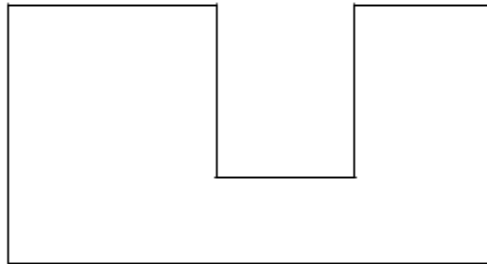
