They both lay on the ground, fighting and clawing to get up again, but before they could do this the mighty peach was upon them. There was a crunch. And then there was silence.

- 8. How do you think Aunt Sponge and Aunt Spiker were feeling?




# Daily times tables

The Year 3 team see this as really important learning so expect you to spend a minimum of 20 minutes a day learning your times tables.


