**Daily reading**

Today, have a go at Activity 2. If you are unable to access this eBook, please use the PDF version of the same story that we have attached for you. Find all of the words with the 'ar' sound. Then find words with the 'or' sound.

**Daily counting**

Can you practise counting in 2s? This might be very new to some of you. Practise with a grown up and see how far you can go!

**Tricky words**

Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.

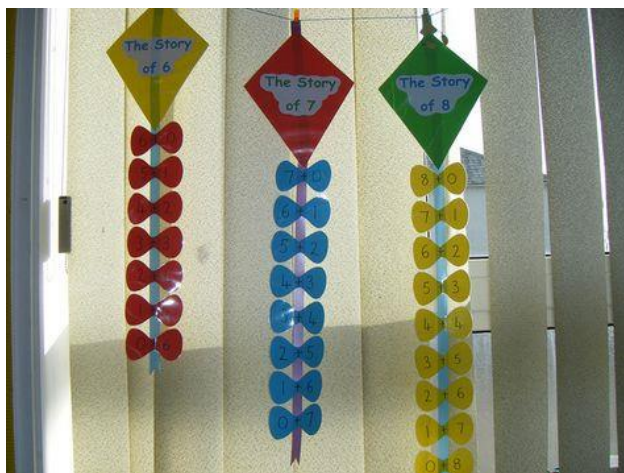
Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Paint a rainbow on your page. Write a tricky word over the top of each colour with a matching felt tip, e.g 'the' could be red, 'I' could be yellow, etc.
- Make the tricky words from play dough. To challenge yourself, make a sentence from play dough including at least 1 tricky word!
- Make your own flip book of tricky words. Flip through each tricky word until you become more confident with them.
- Write the word at the bottom of some kitchen roll for your child. Fold the top over to cover the tricky word. Put the kitchen roll in water and it will magically appear! Ask your child what the tricky word is.
- Have a coloured tray/coloured small plate of flour. Write the tricky word in the flour.

**Daily Maths**

Today's focus is the number 13. What is the story of 13? How many different ways can we make this number?  $1+12=13$ ,  $2+11=13$  etc.

We would like you to make a kite like the one below. Placing the number at the top, can you add on the correct number sentences so that it will fly properly?



This will be a great resource to refer to in the future. Perhaps you would like to hang it up somewhere. If you do not have the suitable resources to complete this activity, please feel free to make a poster or something else exciting!

<b>Daily English/Phonics</b>	<p><b>Phonics:</b> We have finished recapping Phase 2 and 3! For the rest of this week, please make sure your child is secure in Phase 2 and 3 phonics by using these activities. Repeat sounds that your child isn't sure of until they are secure. Next week, we will move onto Phase 4.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Point to each sound on the sound mat and recall</li> <li>- Make phonics flashcards and see how many your child can recall</li> <li>- Use Phonics Play, these games will help your child recall their phonics. Select games from both Phase 2 and 3. <a href="https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/">https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/</a></li> <li>- Use Jolly Phonics songs to recap the sounds <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=U2HYM9VXz9k">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=U2HYM9VXz9k</a></li> </ul> <p><b>Writing:</b> Have a look at page 2 of the story. Do you have a favourite costume? Draw and design your own costume in your book and colour it in carefully. What are you dressed up as? Write about your costume and why you have chosen it. If you're not sure, sound out words to describe your costume. To challenge yourself, write about what you would need to put the costume together. Super writers use: <b>capital letters</b>, <b>full stops</b>, <b>finger spaces</b>, <b>cursive writing</b>! Super writers can also use sound cards and tricky word mats to help them!</p>
<b>Healthy Me</b>	<p>Do you remember watching those lovely dance lessons last week? Today we would love if you could come up with a dance routine to your favourite song!</p>
<b>Daily Challenge</b>	<p>How many rockets can you draw on one A4 page? You might have to make them really small! You could think about carefully colouring them in lots of different colours.</p>
