② Fold all four corners to the centre.

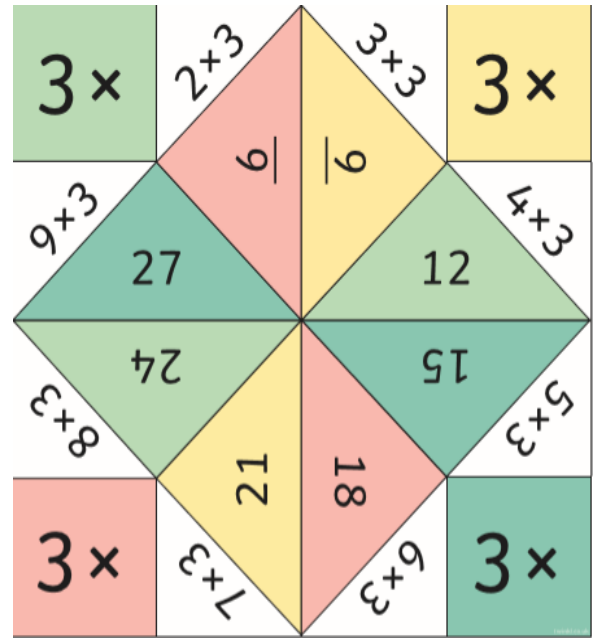
③ Turn paper over.

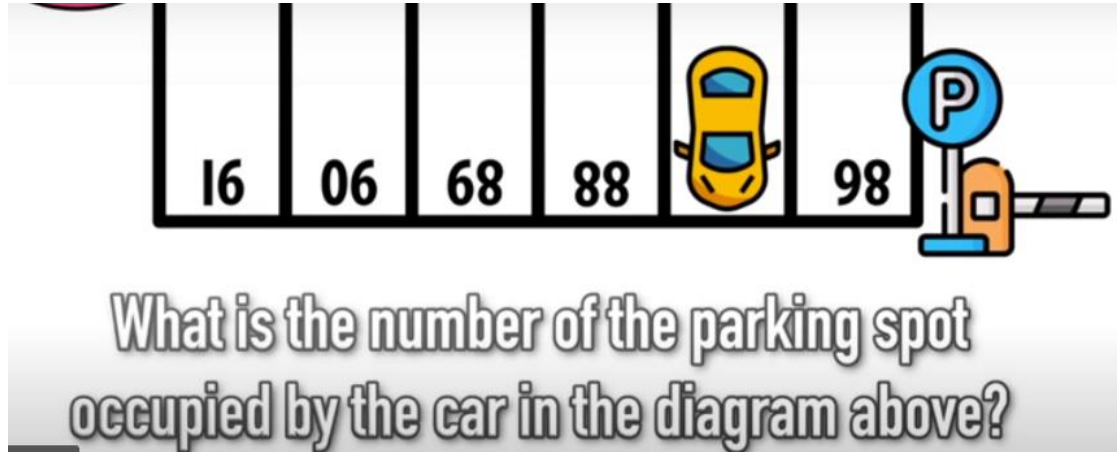
