Yes, it is back by popular demand!

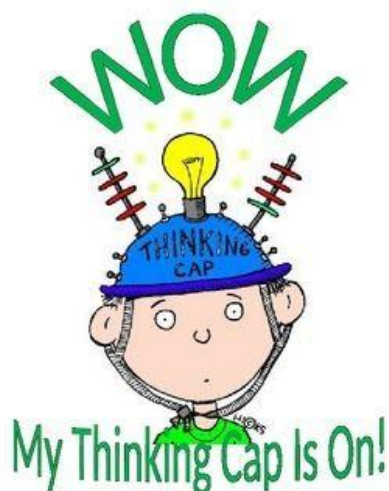
