Daily reading

Today, please read a book of your choice for 10 minutes then spend 5 minutes retelling what you have read and answering questions about it. Please ask an adult to help you with this.

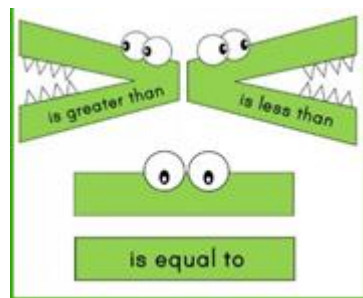
Can you tell someone what happened at the start, the middle and the end of the book you are reading?

Daily counting, number bonds or times tables

Make crocodile 'greater than' and 'less than' signs.



Take 2 groups of objects e.g. bricks, pencils, leaves.

Use the crocodiles to show which is **greater than** or **less than**.

Say **greater than** or **less than** in a sentence.

E.g. 17 (red bricks) is more than 12 (blue bricks).

Termly Spellings

Please take time to learn spellings for future weeks and to re-visit past spellings.

These can be found on the school website at <https://www.newbridge.bathnes.sch.uk/> and go to the tab **Classes** and click on your class.

You could try it this way today.

Write the word out on a sheet of paper ensuring that it is spelt correctly and it is large enough to trace over. Trace over the word and say it at the same time. Move next to the word you have just written and write it out as you say it. Turn the page over and write the word as you say it, and then check that you have spelt it correctly.

Daily Maths

You will need: paper with **North, South, East and West** written on them.

Stick the compass points (North, South, East and West) on to the walls.


Shout out a direction and the children must move as quickly as they can to the correct sign.

Practise learning the compass points.

Tell the children a mnemonic to teach them the compass points

e.g. Naughty Elephants Spray Water

or Never Eat Shredded Wheat.

	<p>Children to draw a compass in the middle of the page.</p> <p>Then, ask them to draw around the compass - a sunshine above the North; an umbrella in the East; a cloud below the South; a snowflake in the West.</p> <p>Challenge – Add on some extra weather symbols and write a sentence to show which direction they are.</p> 
<p>Daily English/ Phonics</p>	<p>Writing: Today, our writing is linked to our learning in R.E. We are learning about Judaism, in particular a Jewish festival called Rosh Hashanah. Please ask a grown up to read the attached information about Rosh Hashanah with you. Talk to your grown up about Rosh Hashanah – what can you remember? Now, in your book you’re going to write some sentences about what happens at Rosh Hashanah. You might like to start by drawing a picture, as this might help you think of ideas. Remember to include a capital letter, finger spaces and full stop for each sentence. Also, if you use the name of the festival it will need a capital letter.</p> <p>Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.</p> <p><i>The girls sing as they go to sleep.</i></p> <p>Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?</p> <p>Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.</p> <p>ind short claws rude</p> <p>Play Quick Write. How many times can you write each word in a minute?</p> <p>here there where</p> <p>Optional game – https://www.phonicstracker.com/games/FootballPhonics/index</p> <p>Or pick a different game on the website at a phase suitable for your child’s ability.</p>
<p>Healthy Me</p>	<p>Time Challenge – How many times can you do a star jump then turn around in 2 minutes? Build a slide! Design a way to slide your favourite teddy down the stairs, off the bed or the back of sofa. How could you make it quicker?</p>
<p>Problem of the day</p>	<p>Challenge – Can you build something that makes a noise? Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to create your noise maker! Riddle - What is black and white and read all over?</p>
