Daily reading

Enjoy reading your book today for 10-15 minutes. The weather is due to be lovely again today so could you create a shelter and take your book outside to read? Don't forget your sun cream and a hat!

Reading activity:

Have you read any books lately that you've really enjoyed? Recommend that book to a friend and explain why it is worth a read. Will you be able to convince them to read it?

Top Tips:

- Prior to reading, encourage your child to focus on the title of the book, the author, the illustrator and the front cover. Make predictions about what you think will happen in this book based on these factors. Afterwards, read the blurb and see if it gives you any further hints.
- Continue asking your child questions throughout the book but also encourage them to ask questions as this will further their understanding of the text.
- When you have finished the story, is your child able to retell the events in the order in which they happened? If you are reading non-fiction, can they recall any interesting facts that they have read?

Daily counting, number bonds or times tables

Can you write all of the number bonds to 20 or 100? Time yourself and make a note of your time. Are you getting quicker?

Here are some pictures of people throwing things in Olympic events. The first one shows a man throwing a hammer and the second shows a man throwing a discus.



They can throw them a long way. In 2000, the Olympic record for throwing the hammer was about 80 adult paces and for throwing the discus was about 70 adult paces.

How far can you throw a beanbag, ball or frisbee? Work out how far in steps.

Key questions

How far did you throw the beanbag?

How did you measure the distance?

Who threw the beanbag the furthest?

Did you throw it as far as the Olympic record for the discus?

Did you throw it as far as the Olympic record for the hammer throw?
