
Daily Maths

What is the volume of a cuboid? The volume of a cuboid is the measurement of its 3-dimensional presence or space. A box is a common example of a cuboid. Think of its volume as the total amount of space within it. To calculate the volume of a cuboid simply multiply its length (I) by its width (w) and height (h)


